TWO-DAY WORKSHOP

CONFINED SPACE ENTRY & ENTRY RESCUE



Confined spaces present life-threatening hazards in construction. This workshop is for anyone who is responsible for coordinating or supervising work in confined spaces as well as workers required to enter confined spaces. Course elements include all elements in the one-day Confined Space Awareness course and also detail entry and rescue procedures. This workshop includes an interactive practical demonstration of proper work procedures utilizing required breathing apparatus and rescue equipment.



ONE-DAY WORKSHOPS

AERIAL LIFT



Aerial lift platforms are vital pieces of equipment used at various worksites. Proper use is critical to the safety of both the operator and their coworkers. Topics covered in this workshop will include: types and components of platforms, preoperational (safety) requirements, safe operation techniques, and fall protection.

BASIC FIRST AID WITH CPR



Have you ever been first on the scene? This nationally recognized training will provide attendees with practical assessment techniques and basic life saving skills in: artificial respiration; choking; bleeding; bandaging of wounds; dealing with shock/unconsciousness; identifying heart attack and stroke victims; and CPR. An official First Aid/CPR certificate will be issued, which is valid for three years.

H2S ALIVE



This course informs workers on the hazards they might encounter while working in an area that has hydrogen sulfide (H2S). Hydrogen sulfide is a colourless gas that occurs naturally from the earth's environment or can be produced by human activities. It takes very little exposure of this hazardous substance to cause serious illnesses and even death. This course covers: what hydrogen sulfide is, where can it be found; testing and exposure limits; first aid; and treatment to H2S exposure.

HAZARD IDENTIFICATION & RISK CONTROL



Participants will learn four methods of identifying hazards, along with how to assess risk and implement methods to control risk. Emphasis is placed on workplace inspections and safe work procedures. This workshop will be particularly useful to supervisors, safety and health committee members, managers, and employers, but will benefit workers as well.

SUPERVISOR 2.0



As a worksite supervisor or member of a management team, you have responsibility and accountability for those under your direct supervision. Attend this workshop and receive the tools and information you need to demonstrate due diligence. Relevant and practical information will be discussed in regards to identifying the risk of MSIs, possible impairment, communication and conflict resolution, psychological hazards, control methods, and required training.

WORKING AT HEIGHTS



In Manitoba, the workplace safety requirements for fall protection are very strict. Often forgotten is the legal requirement to also ensure an employer includes an Emergency Rescue Plan in the event of a fall. This workshop will provide participants with information on the Manitoba fall protection requirements and detail the steps to take in the event of a fall. Participants will also have the opportunity to discuss horizontal and vertical fall arrest systems, guardrail alternatives and CSA Standards.

HALF-DAY WORKSHOPS

ASBESTOS AWARENESS (TUES. A.M. ONLY)

Participants will learn the origin of asbestos, the different types of asbestos, and typical uses of asbestos in construction. This workshop will include an awareness of the hazards with exposure to asbestos, an introduction to the relevant provincial regulations concerning asbestos, the importance of an asbestos inventory and asbestos control plan, and an awareness of the emergency situations related to asbestos.

CONSTRUCTION SITE

COMMUNICATION (WED. ONLY)

Communicating key safety information is an essential component of a safety management system. This workshop is geared toward supervisors, safety representatives, and anyone tasked with the responsibility of ensuring worker safety. Due diligence, documentation, and reasonable and practical techniques for communicating essential safety information will be highlighted.

FIT FOR DUTY – IMPAIRMENT TRAINING

Employers have the obligation to ensure that ALL employees are adequately protected and safe on their worksites. The aim of this seminar is to educate supervisors about impairment. Impairment can be caused by anything from lack of sleep, medication, to alcohol and drug use, and its impacts on worksites can be very serious. This workshop will discuss supervisors' responsibilities in addressing impairment and possible policy violations — including procedures for reasonable cause — and tools to help overcome the challenges in implementing the policy.

HOISTING & RIGGING (TUES. ONLY)

This workshop is designed for anyone working in the construction or fabrication industry who works with hoisting and rigging equipment. Participants will be introduced to the different types and applications of hoisting equipment such as overhead cranes, boom trucks, tower cranes, and mobile cranes as well as the different types of rigging equipment such as slings, hooks, and shackles and how they are inspected and used to properly connect loads to be hoisted. This course emphasizes the importance of following the Workplace Safety and Health Regulation and its associated standards regarding hoisting and rigging in the workplace.

INCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS

Investigations are a required element of an effective workplace safety and health program. Participants will learn the steps involved in conducting effective investigations. Legal requirements for incident reporting and investigation will also be discussed. The information presented can be applied to all types of investigations, including: right to refuse, harassment, violence, worker concerns, near misses, and serious incidents. Supervisors; safety and health committee members; managers; employers; and workers will leave this workshop with clarity of their roles and responsibilities and the tools and resources required for application.

INSPECTIONS

The identification of hazards is a vital component of an organization's overall safety and health management system and a legal requirement under the Workplace Safety and Health Act and Regulation. This workshop will provide supervisors and safety representatives with information on various types of inspections, hazard assessment, required documentation, and communication and control techniques.

LEAD AWARENESS (WED. P.M. ONLY)

Numerous construction operations have the opportunity to expose personnel to lead, which is a toxic element and leading cause of work-related illness. Workers exposed to lead on the job can expose their families by tracking lead into their homes on their footwear and clothing. Construction lead awareness is critical to protecting workers and their loved ones from adverse health effects.

This lead awareness training course presents an overview of lead exposure, including the sources of lead in construction, modes of exposure, and applicable legislation. Topics include health problems identified with lead exposure, developing an exposure control plan, and lead sampling and analysis.

HALF-DAY WORKSHOPS

LEGISLATION 101 - UNDERSTANDING WORKPLACE SAFETY & HEALTH ENFORCEMENT (TUES. ONLY)



Confusion and sometimes fear or negativity often accompany a visit from a Workplace Safety and Health (WSH) Officer on a jobsite. This presentation facilitated by WSH Officers will help participants understand why officers visit worksites, what your responsibilities are once an officer comes on site, what is involved in WSH inspections and investigations, and what exactly an improvement order or stop work order is, as well as how to satisfy the order. This is a workshop designed to give participants a solid understanding of Manitoba's WSH legislation. Attend this presentation for the practical interpretation of the workplace law and how it affects your company.

LOAD SECUREMENT



Everyone who pulls a flatbed for a living knows that properly securing cargo to a trailer is key to safe and profitable operation. This load securement course explains valuable ways to prevent load loss; trip delays; increased insurance rates; injury; and damage to cargo, vehicles, and property.

MATERIAL HANDLING IN CONSTRUCTION



This workshop will be a combination of theory and practical. Participants will get a better understanding how back and other injuries develop and how safe movement patterns can prevent them. A significant part of the course will be hands on practicing a variety of safe movements in various manual material handling scenarios.

MOULD AWARENESS (TUES. P.M. ONLY)

Mould is recognized as a significant factor in indoor air quality in a variety of buildings. Indoor exposure to mould can cause a range of symptoms due to allergic and toxic responses. Authorities at multiple levels enforce regulations and guidelines to assess and control exposure to mould in buildings. This workshop will include common causes of mould growth; health effects related to mould exposure; regulations and guidelines; testing methods and interpretation; and measures for abatement and prevention of mould growth.

PROJECT SAFETY PLANS

Workplace safety and health (WSH) legislation requires a prime contractor to be designated on all construction projects where more than one employer or self-employed person(s) are involved in work on site at the same time. The prime contractor is granted overall responsibility to ensure compliance with WSH Regulations at the worksite. Worksite activities need to be coordinated so that the work of one employer does not create unsafe conditions for the workers of another employer on the site. Since construction projects vary in size, hazard exposure, and working conditions, a written site-specific plan has become customary for all construction projects regardless of size and duration. This workshop will focus on providing companies with effective guidelines to assist them in fulfilling their responsibilities, giving instruction on how to create a project safety plan and help with developing practical methods to meet these requirements.

PSYCHOLOGICAL HEALTH & SAFETY, RESPONDING BEFORE A CRISIS (WED. ONLY)

Mental health issues are common in every workplace, now more than ever. Those in supervisory and management positions can play an important role in developing a supportive workplace environment to prevent mental health concerns and effectively implement strategies to assist employees who are demonstrating signs of poor mental health at work. This proactive approach can lead to positive outcomes for the employee and employer.

RESIDENTIAL SITE SAFETY FOR SUPERVISORS - SUBCONTRACTOR MANAGEMENT (WED. ONLY)

Do you subcontract your work? Are you an owner of land or buildings where other persons will be hired to conduct their work? Has your company been designated as the prime contractor at a worksite? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you need to be aware of your legal obligations. This workshop provides practical solutions to assist the development of an effective subcontractor management system to ensure that all work is done in a safe manner, in accordance with applicable Workplace Safety and Health Regulations, and allows you to show due diligence.

SAFETY REPRESENTATIVE & COMMITTEE TRAINING



Legally, every employer on every jobsite must have at minimum a designated safety representative and/or a safety committee familiar with their legal duties and responsibilities. What's happening on your worksites? What should you be doing? This workshop is specifically tailored to the roles of the site worker safety representatives and committee members. Learn the guidelines and practical solutions to dealing with your legislated responsibilities for safety and health concerns on the jobsite and within your company.

SILICA AWARENESS (WED. A.M. ONLY)

Silica is the second most common mineral on earth. It comes in many forms with crystalline silica being the most common and the most dangerous to your health. Due to the nature of your work, you may be exposed to silica in several different areas. This course defines silica and identifies where it is found. Participants will learn the potential health effects of silica exposure, how to prevent silica exposure, and when it is necessary to wear respiratory protection.

TRENCHING & EXCAVATION



Construction work conducted in trenches and excavations is some of the most hazardous in the industry. This course discusses excavation and trenching hazards, including electrical hazards, with emphasis on safe work practices, procedures, and current technology. The Workplace Safety and Health Regulation, as it pertains to excavation and trenching, will be detailed along with provincial guidelines and codes of practice.

SAFETY ADMINISTRATION (TUES. ONLY)



This workshop provides participants with the knowledge and skills to effectively manage and monitor a safety and health management system. This course focuses on the organization and maintenance of safety program documentation and how to implement and maintain a continuous improvement cycle.

WCB 101 (TUES. ONLY)



This workshop will provide participants with a general understanding of the Workers Compensation Board of Manitoba system and its relationship with the construction industry. The participant will be provided with some general insight into the claims process and rate setting, allowing them to decide how their role may be impacted.
